TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

It is our pleasure to inform you that Miss Kate Kelso, a student at your University, interned with the Serbian War Crimes Prosecutor's Office (WCPO) in the period between June 1 and July 15, 2010, within the framework of the first international internship program for prospective legal professionals.

Miss Kate Kelso was assigned to the WCPO Public Relations Service, where she was involved in the analysis of the world media reports on the activities of our Office, on promotion of those activities, and on the performance of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia.

In the course of her internship training, Miss Kelso demonstrated a keen interest in cases handled by our Office, and was therefore able to see how international humanitarian law practically works in war crimes proceedings in Serbia, but also elsewhere in the region, in view of the fact that our Office has active cooperation with its counterparts in the former Yugoslav states.

With a view to gaining a more comprehensive insight into the transitional processes currently under way in Serbia, Miss Kelso took part in a number of promotions and panel discussions addressing the issue of justice in transition. She also established contacts with representatives of the ICTY office in Serbia, members of the OSCE Mission to Serbia, as well as with the NGO and media representatives, which can be seen in the interview made with her and published in the local daily *Danas* on August 21.

It was a great honor and professional satisfaction for the War Crimes Prosecutor's Office to host a student of Georgetown University and enable her to obtain an overview of war crimes proceedings conducted before the Serbian judicial authorities. We also believe that her visit marked the beginning of future cooperation between our Office and your University, which will encourage resourceful and

creative exchange of professional views and experience between law students and young legal professionals from the U.S.A. and Serbia.
